VPS Portfolio:

Events:

There is a lack of career planning and connecting for all students, I want to remedy this situation as soon as possible, because looking down the line at graduation I want to be able to take advantage of every opportunity to ensure that my fellow students and I are going into the workforce well equipped with not only a degree but with career connections and experience.
